GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All exhibitors must pay a \$10.00 Exhibitor Fee when making entries.
- 2. *Please Note, if entries are <u>prepaid</u>, meaning paid by entry close time of 12 noon on Monday June 26, one <u>free</u> <u>weekend gate pass per animal</u> will be given to livestock exhibitors, to a maximum of 6 passes. <u>Entries must be prepaid</u>. It will be based on stall fees of \$15 or box stall fee of \$20. ***Regular gate passes of \$15 per day will apply after Monday at noon. Cash, Cheque or e-transfer will be accepted. Everyone will be required to wear an "Admission Bracelet".
- 3. All entry forms must be accompanied by a cheque or cash for the full amount. Cheque to be made payable to Dauphin Agricultural Society. There will be no Visa. *NEW if you would like to pay by e-transfer please e-mail dauphinagsociety@hotmail.ca for the security question and answer. Entries must be in by noon, Monday, June 26, 2023.

*** Early Entry Draw - if entries are in by noon on Monday, <u>June 19</u> exhibitors will be entered to win their entry fee back to a maximum of \$100

- 4. In the absence of competition in any section, or if the stock exhibited shall be of inferior quality, the judges shall award only such premiums as they think the article or stock merits.
- 5. Stock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor or his authorized agent.
- 6. Exhibits that have been erroneously entered, may at the discretion of the judges or director in charge, be transferred to the proper classes, previous to the judging. If such classes have been judged, they shall not be re-judged.
- 7. All stock in the Purebred Classes must be recorded in records recognized by the Canadian Department of Agriculture and the registration certificate produced on demand.
- 8. Horses competing in heavy horse classes are not eligible to compete in light horse classes and vice versa.
- 9. All animals competing for championships must have been shown previously in a regular class.
- 10. All stalls will be bedded on arrival of exhibits and must be cleaned by 8:00 a.m each day so that the refuse can be taken away before arrival of visitors, and must be kept clean.
- 11. Only animals officially entered will be provided with barn accommodations. Accommodations will be allotted as entries are received. A fee of \$15.00 will be charged per horse. Box stalls allocated for mare & colts only at \$20.00. Any exception to be at approval of Horse Committees. Tack stalls available if room permits.
- 12. No person will be allowed to interfere with the Judges at any time. Should any exhibitor so interfere he or she will forfeit all claims to any premiums to which he or she might otherwise be entitled. Judges' decision is final.
- 13. Should any fraud, deception, or dishonest practice be discovered on the part of any exhibitor or his agent, the Board of Directors may withhold any prize awarded, and may prohibit any exhibitor for exhibiting for such time as the Board may determine, and may publish the name of such exhibitor should they deem it proper to do so.
- 14. Any exhibitor lodging a protest must make such protest in writing and deliver to the Secretary on the day the protested award is made, accompanied by a deposit of \$5.00. Should the protest be successful the \$5.00 will be returned.
- 15. A fee of \$50.00 will be charged to exhibitors who require electrical outlets for campers on the fairgrounds during the fair. A fee of \$30 will be charged for campers not requiring electrical, but generators will be permitted but we ask that they not run over night. Exhibitors must provide description, length, etc. of their unit on entry form. Exhibitors can find out their camper stall # by inquiring at the barns or there will be signs posted in barns. NO HORSE TRAILERS (unless they have living quarters) WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARK IN CAMPGROUNDS.
 HORSES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN CAMPGROUND AREA. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 16. No visitors to the Fair Grounds of the Society nor any person or persons, firm or corporation, of theirs or its agents, representatives, servants and or employees, having holdings or enjoying any license or privilege to exhibit at any time on the fair grounds of the Society, or occupying any space therein for exhibition or any other purposes shall have any claim or right to claim for damages arising from or as a result of any injury or injuries to any person or persons or to any property while on the Fair Grounds of the Society, nor shall any claim or demand in respect thereof, ever be made, nor shall any

suit against the Society in respect thereof be instituted or maintained.

- 17. If any damage, loss of injury to person or property shall be caused by reason of neglect or wilful act of any person, firm or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees, having license or privilege to exhibit on said Fair Grounds or occupying any space therein the Dauphin Agricultural Society shall in no manner be responsible therefore, and in case it be subjected to any expense or liability, all persons causing or liable thereof shall indemnify the said Society.
- 18. All Jr. Classes, age is determined by January 1st of the current year.

Please Note:

- a) Entry fees as noted for each section. Due to changes in stall fees, there will be no entry fees for line classes, except for Class 24.
- b) All entries must be in by noon, Monday, June 26, 2023. See attached form.

***Early Entry Draw - if entries are in by noon on Monday, <u>June 19</u> exhibitors will be entered to win their entry fee back to a maximum of \$100

- c) Exhibitors are limited to two entries per class.
- d) All animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor.
- e) Exhibitors will be allocated one vehicle pass each. Pass must be displayed in window of vehicle at all times.
- g) All foals to be on halter at all times-in ring and around fair grounds
- h) **Exhibitors will be allowed to unload vehicles by barns but** then are required to park all vehicles in the assigned parking area. Each Exhibitor will be allocated one vehicle pass. **Vehicles without vehicle passes will not be allowed to park on fair grounds.**
- i) All horses must be on grounds by 8 am each day and may leave at 7 pm each day.
- j) There will be no loading of livestock or trailer movement until 7:00 pm on Sunday, July 2nd Exhibitors must leave by designated gate only.
- k) In case of a rain out, 50% of 1st place prize money will be paid out to all entries per class.
- m) <u>Ribbon Recycling Program If you would like to recycle your ribbons the Dauphin Ag society will pay you the following: Flat ribbon -\$0.25 each and Rosette \$2.00 each. All ribbons must be in excellent condition. Please take to them to the office and the money will be added to your prize money</u>

n)Violation of these rules may result in forfeitures of prize money and possible fines.

o)****All Championship Classes are Ribbons or Awards only.*** (except for championship team)
